

Faculty Position in Ophthalmology

Development of a research program and publication in peer-reviewed journals are expected and encouraged. Teaching responsibilities will include training of students, graduate students, interns and residents.

The section of Comparative Ophthalmology comprises one faculty, one resident and two part time employed junior assistants with state of the art facilities and equipment. The Veterinary University of Vienna provides a dynamic teaching environment, collaborative opportunities are available within the college as well as with the college of medicine.
