Professional Doctorate in Veterinary Medicine (Residency) in Veterinary Ophthalmology

Applications are invited from highly motivated veterinary graduates with relevant clinical experience for a Professional Doctorate in Veterinary Medicine (Residency) in Veterinary Ophthalmology based at Easter Bush Campus, Roslin, Midlothian. You will be based at the Hospital for Small Animals and will gain intensive experience in managing ophthalmology cases. You will be working towards the European Diploma in Ophthalmology, and, additionally, a doctorate of veterinary medicine degree.

The scholarship will commence in March 2021 and will run for a four-year fixed-term, renewable annually subject to completion of required DVetMed components. The successful applicant must have fully registered with the RCVS at the time of appointment. Applicants should also hold appropriate English language qualifications, where necessary.

The residency attracts an annual tax-free stipend of £20,018.03 with a supplement payable for on-call duties and an additional allowance of £600 per annum available for approved travel, examination fees and CPD. Postgraduate fees will be paid by the University of Edinburgh at UK level.
