

## Internship in Veterinary Ophthalmology at the Tierärztliche Praxis für Augenheilkunde in Nuremberg, Germany

The Tierärztliche Praxis für Augenheilkunde in Nuremberg, Germany is offering an one-year clinical ophthalmology internship, which will begin October 1st, 2018. It's aim is to provide a successful candidate with a clinical and surgical training experience in veterinary ophthalmology and may help the candidate prepare for admission into a residency training program. The internship includes the responsibility for hospital in-patients and out-patients in an affiliated clinic. Horses are seen in two horse clinics. Exotics are seen either as in-patients or at Nuremberg Zoo. The ophthalmology-only intern will work alongside one diplomate and a certified veterinary ophthalmologist (also a national eye-panel member) and take primary care of inpatients. The intern will have the opportunity to participate for non-credit hours in journal club and literature review. The responsibility for our ophthalmology emergency duty (excluding late nights) is shared with the two ophthalmologist of the clinic after an introduction period. Nuremberg is an attractive city of +500.000 inhabitants in southern Germany with a well-preserved medieval inner city (<https://tourismus.nuernberg.de/en/>). Despite an metropolitan area population of 1.25 million it offers plenty of opportunities for outdoor recreation and world-famous heritage sites like Rothenburg o.T. and Bamberg to name a few.

Pre-requisites for acceptance into the program are:

1. DVM degree or equivalent (licensed to work as a vet in Germany).
2. A general internship of one year or two years postgraduate experience are mandatory.
3. A fair to good command of the German and English language is necessary.

The following application materials are required:

1. A letter of intent
2. Current curriculum vitae
3. One to two letters of recommendation from faculty members or practitioners who have worked directly with the candidate. The letter(s) should be sent directly from the recommending doctor(s) to the email below.
4. Veterinary School transcript.
